	Our comprehensive afterschool program will
	provide students with a safe, positive, and
	supportive environment in which students can
	receive personalized learning interventions that
	will explicitly teach critical social, emotional, and
	academic skills needed in order for them to
	achieve at higher levels. Students will be provided
	opportunities to interact with tutors who will
	provide personalized instruction in content areas,
	especially math and reading, using intervention
	programs such as Pirate Math and Reading Plus
	to not only make up for academic loss but also to
	accelerate academic achievement. Students will
	also have opportunities to participate in both
	large and small group activities, outdoor
	experiences, imaginative play opportunities,
	small experiments with everyday products, nature
	walks and talks as well as music, dance, and
	drama activities. Professional development will
	be provided to our staff and will emphasize the
	need to prepare engaging units of study that will
	intrigue students and encourage regular
	attendance. Afterschool staff will collaborate with
	teachers in order to provide seamless support of
	classroom instruction.

	will be weekly themes based on student inquiry
	and choice that will provide opportunities for
	students to practice and reinforce their learning with a culminating activity or event, such as
	related field trips, guest speakers, and students
	hosting presentations for community members.
